Purpose: To use my knowledge of fractions to cut a rectangle into halves. What you need:

- the rectangle photo


Instructions:
Using a single line to cut this shape into halves, start at one letter and finish at another. Write down the letters at the ends of your lines. Give as many different possibilities as you can.

Extension: Can you create halves of the rectangle with a line that bends? OR You could choose a different fraction like thirds or quarters and see how many ways you can divide the rectangle.
