Year	Stall Name	Donations Required		
F	Lollie Jars	1 jar filled with Iollies from each student		
1	Bake Sale	Cakes, slices etc. School will send home ingredients stickers, freezer bags and plates. NOTE: families from other Year levels can contribute to the bake stall.		
2	Mini golf	Bags of lollies from parents e.g snakes, lolly pops, wrapped lollies.

#### Cake Stall:

The Year One stall is the cake stall. We are calling on any other families who wish to provide cake/slices or scones to the stall. Please collect a pre-prepared plate/gab/ingredients package from the office if you can.

### Parking:

In the event that parking is stretched on Friday afternoon, we can suggest families use the racecourse grounds as an overflow option. This is located on the corner of Brockley street and Hamilton Smith drive. The "blue tree" is a landmark that might help families navigate where to park.

### 2024 Student Placements - LAST WEEK TO DO THIS

Families have one more week to email me any parent request for pairing or separations for the 2024 school year. This is not compulsory, but an opportunity for families to support setting up their child for success.

Reminder note: There are three types of parent requests the school will consider when using parent input into the process.

- Parents can request a separation. Valid reasons why their child would not learn to the best of their abilities if in the same classroom as a particular student.
- Parents can request a pairing. This requires both sets of parents to put in writing a request for their children to be in the same classroom.
- Parents can request a type of teaching style. This requires a description of the attributes their child learns best with, parents are unable to request a particular teacher (by name)

All previous year's requests made by families need to be re-submitted. Families with twins may also consider letting the school know about their desire for their children to be placed together or apart. The deadline for parent requests is Tuesday October 31st.

On Tuesday the 17th of October all students had a voice regarding their placement by nominating five (5) learning partners which they rank from 1 to 5. This initiative is to support students transition between year levels confidently knowing they have a familiar and supportive face in the class with them.

# **Toileting**

Due to some increasing issues with students soiling or wetting themselves, we will be reinforcing the current procedure:

- -If a student presents to the first aid room wet or soiled, and they DO NOT have a change of clothes/underwear in their school bag, the parents will be called to come to school to supply clothes or take the student home.
- -If the student has a change of clothes/underwear in their school bag they will be guided to change/clean themselves in the toilet in the first aid room and then returned to class.

We are having to reinforce this procedure to best structure the use of the first aid room toilet, to be able to fully assist students with diagnosed medical conditions.

### A message about developing a growth mindset for Maths learners. - from Limitless Mind (Jo Boaler, 2019).

"Parents regularly praise their children by telling them how smart they are in order to build up their self-confidence. We now know that when we praise children for being smart, they first think, "Oh good, I am smart, " but then later when they struggle, fail or mess up in some way, as everyone does, they think "Oh, I am not so smart"; they end up constantly evaluating themselves against this fixed idea. It is fine to praise children, but (try to) praise what they did and not them as people. Here are some alternatives for use in situations where you may feel the need to use the word "smart". "


Fixed Praise	Growth Praise
Can you divide the fraction? Wow, you are smart!	You can divide fractions? That is great that you have learned how to do that.
You solved that tricky problem like that? That is so smart!	I loved your solution to the problem; it is so creative.
You (he, she, they) have a degree in science? You (he, she, they) are a genius!	You (he, she, they) have a degree in science? You (he, she, they) must have worked really hard.
