NATIONAL DAY OF ACTION AGAINST BULLYING & VIOLENCE - Friday March 19th

Our school is committed to addressing anti-social behaviour and we actively seek ways to support students in making positive choices towards their socialisation. This can be highlighted with our involvement in the *National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence* which is occurring this Friday.

Our students and staff will join hands on the Brockley Street oval to spell out the important message of **Bullying NO WAY, WPS in Harmony**. Our student leaders are a driving force in organising the event and coordinating the students on the day. Lessons and messages of anti bullying are a big part of the messages given in class and while playing in the yard. We continue to encourage our community to connect with us in order to work together when problems such as bullying arise.

MOBILE PHONES

At this morning's assembly, I reminded our senior students that mobile phones are to be safely stored at the office. Additionally, I asked that phones are taken directly to the office once arriving at school. Some students have been using their phones in the yard between 8:45am and 9:00am. It's important that the Mobile Phones - Student Use policy is adhered to for the safety of all our students.

Families who have students who drop their phone into the office each day, please remind your child to take it straight to the office. Thanks in advance for your support with this.

UNIFORM

As the cooler mornings are creeping up on us, please ensure your child/ren are in full school uniform. We are conscious that our uniform is a mandatory requirement and is so for a number of reasons outlined in our Student Dress Code policy. At assembly this morning, I spoke to the students about the importance of wearing a uniform for school pride and also that when we see non-uniform clothing in the yard, it spikes an alert that there is an intruder on our grounds. I finished off the talk by encouraging students to check if their clothing has their names on the items. PLEASE ENSURE YOUR STUDENT JUMPERS AND BELONGINGS ARE LABELLED CLEARLY WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.

EASTER HAT PARADE: Thursday April 1

Students are encouraged to create an Easter Hat at home with their family and bring it to school on the last day of Term 1. We will be parading around the courtyard from 9:10 - 9:45am. 


OLDEN DAYS DRESS-UP AND GAMES DAY: Year 1 - March 25th


The Year 1 students have been learning about 'My Family – Then and Now' during their Discovery unit. Students have strengthened their connections to their family history through sharing items of historical interest and stories from their families' past. We have explored objects from the past and what families might have used them for.

On Thursday March 25th, Year 1 students are invited to dress-up from any era stretching back as far as the 1850s. We will be exploring how children's games have changed over time, and playing games from the past. This will be an opportunity for students to go further with their learning about the unit and reflect on the knowledge they have acquired along the way.

We understand that people might not have items of clothing at home, so we ask families don't feel pressured to purchase items to wear on the day. Students can wear their school uniform and still participate in the planned activities.

Due to Covid 19 restrictions and DET guidelines there will not be an Olden Days Parade with parents onsite. Rather the students will show their costumes throughout the day within their own year level. We will hopefully have some great photos to share later on.
