# Principal's Message

Dear Families and Friends,

We have the annual NAPLAN nationwide standardised test commencing next week. Years 3 and 5 families have been communicated directly about this, however, if you have any questions or feel you may have missed some communication, please reach out to your child's classroom teacher.

#### Do you know how yard supervision is coordinated at our school?

Our school grounds are a great place for our students to play and socialise. We have 15 teachers on duties at every break and 6 education support staff. The staff where high-viz vest to ensure students can find an adult for support.
